**PARISH MISSION STATEMENT:** *The Catholic Community of Good Shepherd strives to live Christ's word daily by our commitment to worship, stewardship, faith formation, Catholic schools, family, and social outreach.*

In the time of Lent as well as preparing for Easter, I have taken time to reflect on one of the key words we use in our celebration of the Mass. This word is special because we stop using it during our penitential season and then begin using it again in our celebration of Easter. It is one of the few words that we use in another language, no matter what language is being spoken. This word, of course, is Alleluia! The roots of the word are quite interesting and involved. Many people think that it is strictly a Hebrew word, though the spelling is slightly different. When the Bible was later translated into Latin, the spelling became what we know and use today. So, how many of us know what we're saying and why?

We can break down the word into two parts, Allelu and yah (or shortened 'ia'). Let's take the second word first. Yah is the Hebrew shortened and poetic word for God (YHWH or Yahweh). It can be found in many combined words in our Hebrew scripture. Elijah means "Yah is my God." Isaiah means "Salvation of Yah." Jeremiah means "Whom Yah has appointed." Other words include Joshua or Yahshua, which leads us to the word Jesus, Kumbayah or "Come be my God," or even some more common words such as "yeah" and "yes." It was through the use of the word Yah that the Hebrew people could refer to God without using the unspeakable name.

The first part of the word Alleluia means "you (plural) give praise," so when you put them together, you get AlleluYAH or "(All you people) give praise to God." This



word appears many times in the Old Testament and several times in the New Testament, especially in Revelation as the holy song of praise from the angels. Now, it becomes our song of praise – right here and now – to sing with all the heavenly hosts.

Alleluia is a song of joy and praise and exalting God in everything we do. It's about giving praise to God with every fiber of our being, in our words and actions, our whole body and mind. When we use this word in our liturgy, we join symbolically with the angels giving God thanks and praise. We believe that Christ is found in three places during the Mass: in speaking of the Word of God (the readings), in the sacrifice of the Eucharist, and in the assembly of the people of God. What better reason to give praise to God than knowing He comes to us in so many marvelous ways? We are called to be an Alleluia people. After having come through the desert of Lent and reflected on the Passion of Christ during the Holy Week liturgy, we know that the story isn't complete till the Alleluia is once again sung at Easter. This serves to teach us that, no matter what we've been through, there is hope for resurrection. Sometimes we forget that Good Shepherd has a resurrection statue proudly displayed for all to see as we enter our Church. Maybe we should let this image and symbol of new life permeate our lives with joy and hope. Our living God is here among us, now and always.

Alleluia! Happy Easter!

## MEN'S CLUB

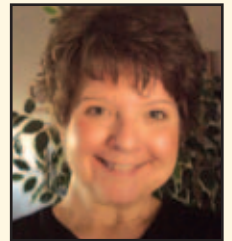
The Men's Club furnished and prepared 600 hamburgers for the Source and Summit Youth Retreat.

**Book Fair**

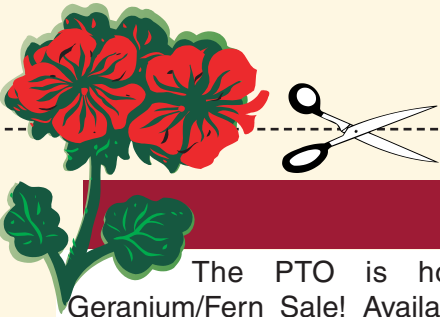
The annual Scholastic half price book sale will be held April 13-15 in Room 100. This is a great opportunity to purchase books to encourage summer reading.

### TEENPOWER Presents "LIVE FROM THE RED CARPET" Teenpower Night at the Movies!

Twenty-nine Good Shepherd students attended TEENPOWER camp this past summer. (A conference sponsored by Youth Resources) As a part of this delegation, these youth had the opportunity to share information and ideas, join in educational workshops and listen to numerous speakers on the awareness of drugs, alcohol and tobacco use in the Evansville area. Not only did the youth benefit individually from the valuable information received at the conference, but they were also given the opportunity to implement a positive program for youth in their community.

During the last few weeks we have discussed and written a grant to provide a program to the sixth, seventh and eighth grade students from Good Shepherd School and the east side feeder schools of Memorial. Our Teenpower staff feels the need to address the youth of our school communities concerning the dangers and negative influences that the media puts out about drugs and alcohol to our teens. We would like to teach more about the awareness and responsibility of being drug free. The grant money received will make it possible for the TEENPOWER youth to offer an event that will relate to kids.

In order to get the Message across, the Teenpower youth will sponsor a Red Carpet Affair, Teenpower Night at the Movies on May 1 from 6:30 p.m. until 11:00 p.m. in the parish hall at Good Shepherd. This event will be a full RED CARPET EVENT. This is not a formal event. The youth will come dressed as movie stars. Our idea is to wear prom dresses and suits from the local Goodwill or what can be found in someone's closet.



Once the youth walk the red carpet to the event, we will have party food, and guest speaker, Johnny Kincade will speak on "How the Media Influences our Decision Making."

Then the Teenpower youth will show movie clips. These clips will show how the media has a negative impact on our decision making. The youth will then present facts and statistics concerning the consequences from those movie clips. The evening will end with an after-party/dance. # Heaven Can Wait

## MARCH FOR BABIES

It's America's favorite walking event! When you walk, you give hope to the families of babies born too soon or sick. The money you raise supports programs in your community that help moms have healthy, full-term pregnancies.

This March of Dimes fundraiser will be held Saturday, April 24, 2010. The Elizabeth Ministry at Good Shepherd would like to invite you to join them on this lovely 3-mile walk in downtown Evansville. Let's take a stroll together and at the same time support the miracle of birth. The walk will start at Sunrise Park at 10:00 a.m., with registration beginning at 9 a.m. Brochures are available at the Health Ministry bulletin board. The March of Dimes has a long and distinguished history of accomplishment and wants you to know that the funds contributed are spent wisely. Seventy-five percent of every dime donated goes to fund programs for mothers and babies. Here are some of the ways that support has already helped:

- **Brain:** When a baby is born too soon, even by a few weeks, the brain and other organs haven't had time to fully develop. March of Dimes researchers are continually working to find new ways to effectively prevent premature birth for ALL babies.
- **Eyes:** Blindness can be a consequence of premature birth and certain birth defects. Scientists are studying the causes of premature birth and developing treatments to cure vision defects like retinitis pigmentosa.

- **Smile:** Every year more than 6,800 babies are born with an oral cleft. March of Dimes researchers identified a gene responsible for the condition and are developing the prevention.
- **Heart:** Heart defects affect 1 in every 100 babies--some minor, many severe. Heart defects take more lives than any other birth defect. Advances in diagnosis and surgical treatment mean better survival rates for the tiniest heart patients.
- **Spine:** Fewer babies are born with neural tube defects like spina bifida as a result of March of Dimes folic acid public health education and fortification campaigns.
- **Lungs:** Surfactant therapy and nitric oxide therapy now save the lives of tens of thousands of babies suffering from respiratory distress syndrome after being born too soon.
- **Heel:** Thanks to our volunteer advocacy efforts most states, including Indiana, now screen for 21 or more serious but treatable conditions. A tiny drop of blood from a newborn's heel has the ability to help save a life.
